### How Does It Feel?

Using the colorful and familiar visuals of Lego, the first in this series of four posters asks us to reflect on how it might feel to be a refugee. Raising issues such as exclusion and loneliness, it reminds us of the importance of welcoming refugees into our own communities.

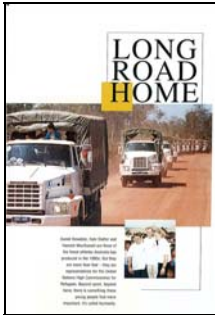
**'I Hope' poster**

This poster from the WRD 2008 *Protection* campaign shows refugees from Darfur, Sudan, making the 'protecting hands' symbol. Underlining the point that refugee protection is first and foremost about safeguarding refugee rights, the poster cites article 14 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, on the right to seek asylum. 2008, A2



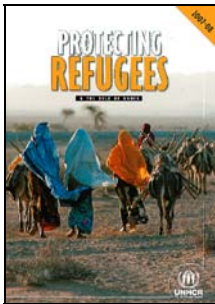
**'Long Road Home' - Video**

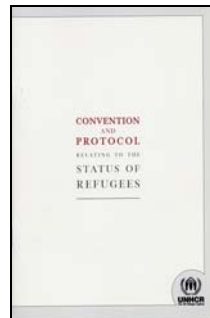
**'Carly' - Video**
